

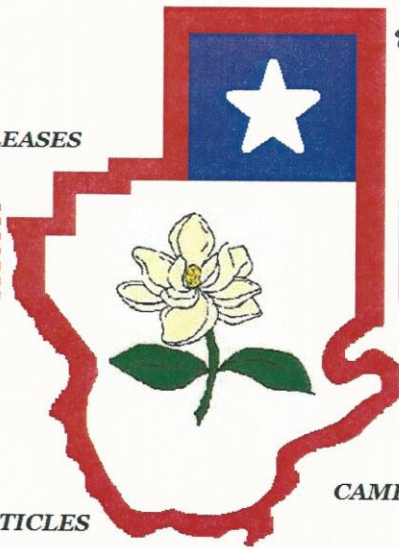

Namesake



Regimental Flag of the 3rd Mississippi Infantry

The Camp takes its name from Co. F, The Shieldsboro Rifles of the 3rd Mississippi Infantry. Formed on August 1, 1861 at Shieldsboro, MS. under the command of Captain Deason (Later Col. Deason), the Regiment served as Coastal Defense for Mississippi until its capture on April 3, 1862. The 3rd Mississippi Infantry Regiment was reformed in May 1862 at Camp Moore in Tangipahoa, LA. It was sent to defend Vicksburg and fought at Champion Hill on May 16, 1863. The regiment served around Jackson, MS. until it was sent to Georgia in the Spring of 1864. It saw action at Resaca, New Hope Church, Kennesaw Mountain, and Peachtree Creek. It fought in the defense of Atlanta & served in the trenches until September 1864. In October 1864, the Regiment was sent back into Alabama participating in the Decatur Skirmish, seeing action in Tennessee at Spring Hill and heavy fighting at Franklin on November 30. In February 1865, they were sent to Kingston & Bentonville in North Carolina. As the tide turned against the South in April, the Regiment surrendered on April 26, 1865 at Durham Station, NC. The Shieldsboro Rifles Camp #2263 meets the last Tuesday of each month in Hancock County, MS.

Second Camp Meeting

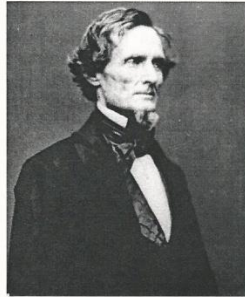

Compatriot Jim Huffman of the Picayune Camp #373 gave a presentation on Confederate Uniforms at the meeting.

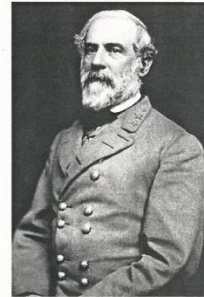
Heritage Attacks

‘Shieldsboro Rifles’ aim to save the MS state flag

The newly formed Hancock County Sons of Confederate Veterans Camp 2263 -- also known as the Shieldsboro Rifles -- held its monthly meeting in Bay St. Louis on Sept. 29 with special guest speaker Jeppie Barbour.

Barbour is the brother of former Mississippi Gov. Haley Barbour and has been a member of SCV for more than 15 years.

During the meeting, Barbour discussed the history and importance of saving the Mississippi state flag.

Barbour said he helped save the state flag when it was under attack in 2001 and plans to do the same now that it is under attack again.

"My goal is to get every part of the state organized for people to get petitions done in a correct manner to vote and to help get the voting done," Barbour said. "We have five districts in the state of Mississippi. If we can get 22,000 signatures from each district -- or 2,000 signatures from 11 counties in each district -- we can send this petition to the Secretary of State to be sent before the legislature and the people of Mississippi can vote on it."

"I am very impressed with the numbers and the interest here along the Coast and I think we have a very good chance of getting our signature total."

"We hope to acquire the necessary signatures that will be needed to save the 1894 state flag of Mississippi by placing it into the state constitution

so it will remain the official flag of this great state," Camp Commander Don Green said.

SCV Camp 2263 is also seeking new members.

"Our goal is to help preserve historic sites and cemeteries and to defend the Confederate heritage -- along with honoring southern culture in and around Hancock County," Green said. "We are open to individuals with ancestors who fought in the war between the states (1861-1865) and we are glad to help with research to find out if an individual has ancestors who fought in the Civil War."

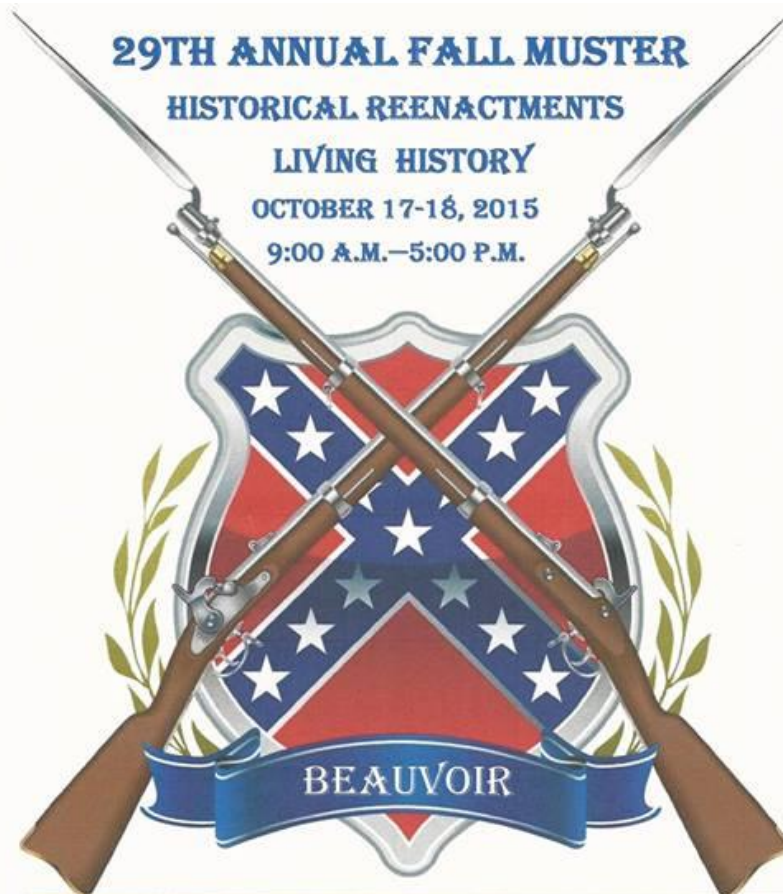

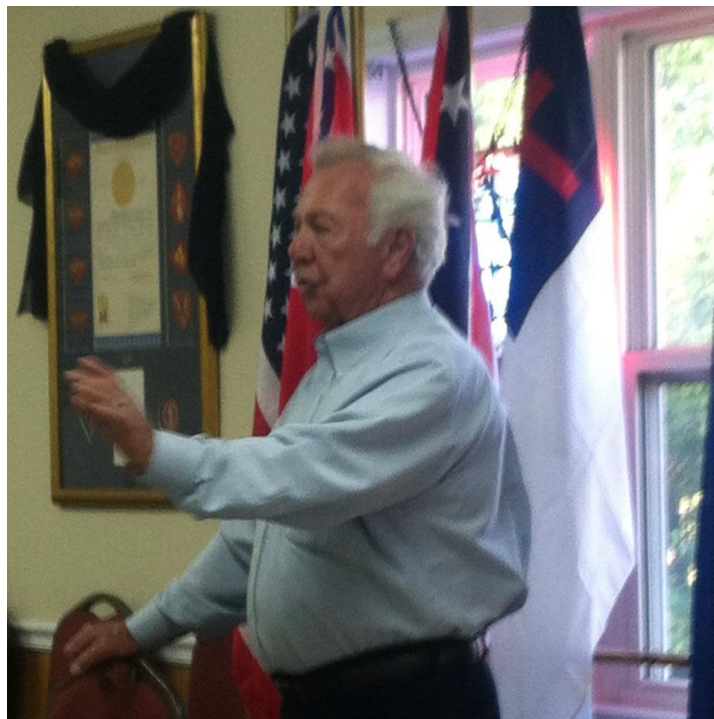
